



EDITORIAL

The editorial Committee continues its series of publications. After the first edition by Mr O. Guidetti we herewith wish to present the NAMSA General Manager's input. These articles will allow you to follow our Agency's development in its rapidly evolving world.

Mr A. CHATZIDAKIS, NAMSA General Manager, since August 2009, pursues a career which comprises two substantially equal periods. Following his career in Greece where he was designated General Officer, the second part of his career started with the Agency, first at the HQ of the Rapid Reaction Forces in Germany and at KFOR in KOSOVO. He then became the Director of the Logistics Division at NATO HQ before taking up his duties as NAMSA General Manager.

It is with great pleasure that I write the editorial for this second edition of the new NAMSA Old Boys Association's "ECHO"; and to pick up on the Chairman's editorial; I could not agree more that communication is critical to any form of society, be it formal or informal.

I thus consider this a welcome opportunity for me to relay my key messages to those people that made the Agency what she is today - a mature multinational logistics organization that has great value to offer to its customers.

You have indeed contributed largely to what the Agency represents, as the follow-on generations of NAMSA staff continue to progress, building on your work and constantly adapting to the rapidly changing logistics environment.

The overall situation at present is that the Agency has indeed a robust portfolio of logistics capabilities and customer base. But while there is an overall upward trend which translates into an extremely positive financial picture, there are also concerns on the horizon. As in the past, one of the biggest challenges is to successfully manage change; this time against a backdrop of budgetary and financial constraints in nations and NATO - something we need to

consider seriously in managing the Agency.

This global aspect – as well as the upward trend in multinational solutions as a proven cost saver, the challenges we are faced with and the opportunities at the horizon that may assure our future relevancy - has been the catalyst for a new initiative: the NAMSA 2020 Strategic Plan.

I have indeed realised that an overall strategy for the future functioning of the Agency is required to sustain or even expand on the achievements already reached through case by case exploitation of emerging opportunities (e.g. demilitarization & dismantlement of weapon systems, strategic lift, environmentally & energy-friendly solutions). We consider this plan to be the key to bringing our human resources, our processes and our technologies in line with our strategy and vision.

At the same time, NATO nations have just recently decided on an Agency Reform effort. Its scope and depth are yet to be defined as we are at the beginning of this process, but it will most certainly affect NAMSA as the main multinational logistics player in NATO and centrepiece in the area of in-service support.

News

Thanks to the interventions of the Associations (Active and retired Staff Associations), the total amount of the adjustment will be paid according to the salary rules and regulations of the Coordinated Organizations.

This is a real cohesion success of united actions underlining the usefulness of our Associations and a reminder of the importance of creating and maintaining strong associations.

Mr. Carl A. HEWITT will leave the Agency at the end of the year. During his stay at NAMSA he welcomed the Association Committee wholeheartedly on different occasions and always showed great interest in our discussions. The Committee presents its sincere and respectful gratitude to Mr. HEWITT and wishes him a long and pleasant retirement in the United Kingdom. The Committee invited his successor Mr. Christopher J. ROSE who attended the 25th October 2010 General Assembly meeting, followed by a luncheon. Mr. ROSE has been nominated the new NAMSA Director of Resources as of 1 January 2011. Brigadier General of British Nationality and born in 1959, Mr. ROSE, a graduate from the University of London, acquired thorough commanding experiences in his country as well as at NATO. Due to his Supreme Headquarters functions he developed excellent competence in organizational, financial and budgetary management, as well as experience in human resources skills. We welcome his arrival and hope that we can maintain all the existing links and further develop our common interests.

First of all a new contract policy is presently under discussion. This would mean that almost all indefinite duration contracts would be eliminated.

At present NAMSA is employing 1043 persons out of which 715 are male and 328 are female. France is the most represented with 20% followed by Belgium with 18,5% and Luxembourg with 15%. 60% of the personnel are

under 50 years old.

VAN BREDA

The Group Insurance Contract has just been renewed between NATO and Van Breda for one more year until the end of 2011 (by mutual agreement). During 2010 the medical insurance branch of Van Breda was bought up by an american medical insurance group (CIGNA). During our October General Assembly meeting the Van Breda Representative assured us that there is no need to worry about a change in policies and that the Van Breda Staff members will be maintained in their functions.
