I am truly honoured, and it is with great pleasure that I provide the editorial for the NOBA ECHO, the periodical magazine of the NAMSA Old Boys Association. I value the association in bringing into closer union and friendship all the former staff members of NAMSA, as well as fostering and perpetuating your interest and connection with your «Alma Mater». I also stand by to assist the Old Boys in any way within the powers of your Association. In my initial contacts with the NOBA Chairman, and having had the chance to address the General Assembly in early November, I have indeed understood your deep and continued interest in the Agency that you have served so many years; an organization that recently has come to a crossroads as it is developing into a new, stronger organization, namely the NATO Support Agency, which I have the privilege to be its General Manager.

If we go back to 2006, as the North Atlantic Council launched a programme to followon from the initial NATO Agencies Review tasked at the 2002 Prague Summit; the programme identified a need for further improvements in the working of NATO Agencies. Because of the financial crisis, operational demands and under the leadership of the current Secretary General, the nations' level of ambition of the Agency Review process grew, and at the meeting of NATO Defence Ministers on 10-11 June 2010, the Secretary General presented his views on the reform, underlining the need to take the financial and operational challenges as an opportunity to make NATO fit for purpose in the 21st century. The Secretary General noted that the Agencies fall, with minor exceptions, into three programmatic areas: procurement, support, and

communications & information, and suggested building the new structure around them. He underscored the goals of this initiative: maximum effectiveness and efficiency in the delivery of capabilities and services, maximum sharing of support services, improved governance by enhancing transparency and accountability to Council, greater synergy between similar functions, and savings. And so NATO embarked on an effort reforming the Agencies landscape in NATO, pursuing the objectives of effectiveness, efficiency and savings, getting us ready to address future fiscal austerity, while preserving capability. In essence, the effort is about developing and delivering our capabilities and services in the most efficient and cost effective manner, and to the extent we can, obtaining savings that the Nations can reinvest in new capabilities to help keep NATO strong into the future.

NATO recently embraced the concept of Smart Defence, a new way of thinking about generating these modern defence capabilities in the coming decade and beyond. It involves pooling and sharing capabilities, setting priorities and coordinating efforts better.

The NATO Support Agency (NSPA) will be a key enabler in NATO's "Smart Defence" framework. We call our vision "Smart Support". Simply put, we intend to combine NATO's existing logistics and procurement support activities into a single organization that fully leverages current capabilities and builds on them to provide integrated support solutions based on best practices for Smart Defence, evolving capabilities and future NATO operations at a lower cost to NATO Nations. In short, we want to be NATO's premier integrated

logistics and services provider team! There are three specific objectives behind the reorganization. They are increasing efficiency, cost savings, and effectiveness.

I used the term "Smart Support" to associate ourselves with NATO's future and show our relevance there. I think that the NATO Support Agency can be a key enabler for NATO in its future missions. When I talked to the Military Committee I told them: "If you really believe that much in what these people do and you are that satisfied with them, any time in the future when you hear somebody talking about a weapon system, a mission, a capability, I want you to ask: "Have we talked to the Support Agency? Have we brought the Support Agency in?". I want the Support Agency to be synonymous with planning for any future NATO capability.

Since the establishment of the new Agency on 1 July 2012, we have been very active, consolidating all resources under one leadership, planning harmonization and rationalization, aiming at our initial targets as defined by the nations. Again, it is a big task but with the talented team that the new Agency brings together, and their track record of accomplishment, I am confident that we can rise to the challenge.

ALLIANZ

Those of us who were present at the Annual General Assembly were able to hear the presentation from Mrs Manahel Mansouri of Allianz during which she recounted how Allianz had been able to overcome teething difficulties following the takeover of the medical insurance contract from Van Breda. At the present time all seems to be in order and the Allianz performance evaluation criteria confirm this.

Mrs Mansouri was also able to discuss particular problems, in private, with nine of our members. We remind you that our two contact points within the committee are Danielle Degrotte (mamylu@pt.lu) and Isabelle Warschburger (isabellew@internet.lu) who have easy and privileged access both to the appropriate office at NATO and to Allianz.

ASSOCIATION EXTERNAL RELATIONS

Our Association is not alone in the NATO galaxy.
It maintains three types of external relations:

1- with Agency offices, the General Manager, the Corporate Support and Plans Director, the Staff Association,

the three Division Chiefs AA, AO and AP. Finally the two legal advisors, the internal auditor, the security service and the canteen manager.

- 2- With the other Associations of retired staff, our friends at the NATO Headquarters International Secretariat. Those at SHAPE in Mons and to a lesser extent, those in Paris.
- 3- With the two Confederations: that which regroups the Civilian Staff Association Committees and ours which represents Associations of retired staff. But also with the Executive Management Division at the International Secretariat, finally with Allianz. We understand that our address book is not that of a "normal" retired staff member. This list gives an idea of the work achieved by the Committee. The team of fifteen in the Committee makes itself available to maintain these relations in the interests of us all, without forgetting future retirees.
